THE CREED

TODAY’S MASS
THEME THOUGHT

We can produce works that are the fruit of the Spirit only if we remain with Christ. This is the main theme of the gospel today and is presented through the image of the vine and its branches.

The second reading draws our attention to another point. Our faith is manifested by works of love. These ensure possession of the life of God in ourselves.

The first reading tells us of Paul who, in spite of all difficulties, misunderstandings and suspicions, preserved his union with Christ and with the community of his disciples.
